Practice Past Papers

Take a first few minutes to plan the structure of your essay, which will save your time when you are delving into meaty parts. Always stay on topic.

Review your answers thoroughly

You will be surprised what you can spot in those last few minutes. This is your last chance, never ever give your paper to examiner without reviewing once.

Remember, the exams are not designed to trick you. Don't panic on the day of your exam, convince yourself that you know how to answer exam questions. All the best!
